All Saints Wednesday, November 1, 2023

All Saints celebrates the baptized people of God, living and dead, who are the body of Christ. At the Lord's table we gather with the faithful of every time and place, trusting that the promises of God will be fulfilled and that all tears will be wiped away in the new Jerusalem.

Amen.



"Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" ¹¹And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²singing,

"Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might

be to our God forever and ever! Amen."


Offering

through Jesus Christ, our Sovereign and Servant.



All who believe with us that Christ is truly present in the bread and wine are invited to communion.



on earth as in heaven.


